

JIM Garrison files charges against Clay Shaw for his supposed involvement in a conspiracy leading to JFK's assassination.

The defendant, Clay Shaw, is charged in a bill of indictment with having willfully and unlawfully conspired with David W Ferrie, Lee Harvey Oswald and others to murder John F Kennedy. The evidence will show that in June 1963 the defendant, Clay Shaw, was present at a party. During the course of the party, the conversation among a small group of those present turned to President John F Kennedy. In this group were David Ferrie and the defendant, Clay Shaw. The comment was made that Psdt Kennedy should be killed and that the job could best be done by a rifle. At this point, the defendant, Clay Shaw, suggested that the man doing the shooting would probably be killed before he could make his escape. The defendant turned to Ferrie and asked if it might not be possible to fly the gunman from the scene of the shooting to safety. David Ferrie replied that this would be possible. At this point the conversation was turned to other subjects. The evidence will further show that in the month of September, 1963, the defendant, Clay Shaw, David Ferrie and Lee Harvey Oswald participated in a meeting in which plans for the murder of Psdt John F Kennedy were discussed and refined.
